

Schutlzy's Leggy Boi



Materials

Thread: 140 Veevus power thread

Body: 1" 2" 3" translucy brush, 1" 2" 3" mimic faux feather brush (substitute Whiting American hen saddle), a pile of rubber legs, flashabou (optional), marabou, EP crustaceous brush

Hardware: Ahrex SA274 #4 or 6, Ahrex SA280 #1/0 or 1, 10mm shank, 15mm shank, 25mm shank, 23mm Senyo shanks (sub connection wire), 5.5mm or 4.6mm tungsten bead

Steps

Tail: 10mm shank, Marabou x2, flashabou, 1 leg each side folded over, 1" mimic faux feather brush

15mm shank: 1" translucy brush trimmed, 2 legs each side folded, 1" mimic faux feather brush

Rear hook: Ahrex SA274 #4, cut 23mm Senyo shank for connection, 1" translucy no trim, 2 legs folded each side, 1" mimic brush

25mm shank: 1" translucy, 2 legs folded each side, 2" mimic brush, 2" translucy trimmed, 2 legs folded each side, 2" mimic brush

Front hook: Ahrex SA280 #1/0, cut 23mm Senyo shank connection, 5.5mm tungsten bead secured in middle, 2" translucy slight trim, 2 legs folded each side, 3" mimic brush to behind bead, more legs, EP crustaceous brush head to finish and trimmed

Notes

- The original used hen saddle instead of the mimic feather brushes. These look great but the brushes are faster to tie with and good hen saddles are hard to come by these days.
- Brush the crustaceous brush as you palmer it forward to keep it tame. You absolutely MUST trim it when you're done. The brush head and tungsten bead are playing a balancing game.
- Fish on an intermediate line in 3-6' of water
